

Slippery Rock Student Government Association (SRSGA) Dismissal Process for Senators

I. Purpose

This policy outlines the process and criteria for the dismissal of Senators from the Student Government Association (SGA). It ensures that all members uphold the standards and responsibilities required of their positions while providing a fair and transparent process.

II. Dismissal Process

- First Instance of Violation:
 - o A written warning will be issued by the Speaker of the Senate.
- Second Instance of Violation:
 - A second written warning will be issued by the SGA Vice President of Internal Affairs.
- Third Instance of Violation:
 - Formal dismissal will be enacted, and a written notification will be sent by the SGA President.

III. Grounds for Dismissal

The dismissal process may be initiated for the following reasons:

- Attendance Violations:
 - o Accumulating three unexcused absences from mandatory meetings or events.
- Failure to Fulfill Duties:
 - o Neglecting responsibilities as outlined in the Senate Bylaws.
- Inappropriate Behavior:
 - Conduct that is inconsistent with the standards expected of an SGA representative.

IV. Right to Appeal

Dismissed Senators have the right to appeal the dismissal. The appeal process will follow
the procedures outlined in the Senate Bylaws.

This policy is binding for all members of the SGA Senate and ensures accountability while maintaining the integrity of the organization.
